In having to wait for dispersal of funds, makes having to get extremely high priced books from the bookstore. Upon talking to other students in different colleges, their money is dispersed quicker.

While I love this university, its faculty, and its curriculums, there are often communication issues about events and deadlines. This can usually be attributed to understaffing, as everyone who works here is overworked. However, it is often frustrating.

Having attended other colleges, I have never had to wait for the financial aid to be disbursed like I do at USAO. I believe the untimely manner in which the financial aid is being dispersed needs to be improved. Many students depend on the financial aid to purchase supply for school. Waiting 5-8 weeks into the school tri semester is too long. As of right now you can get a voucher at the business office to charge at the book store. The problem is if you do not have the finances when school begins to purchase books and supplies, you are then forced to use the college book store that has a large mark up. That is not begins a good steward of the money you are entrusted with!

Love the professors and people of this university, everyone is helpful and kind and I've learned a lot in my time here at this university. I feel like I've become a better overall individual in my time here and it is truly an excellent education. My only wish is that the university could make some upgrades to the facilities to go along with how great the people & teachings are.

I miss having one of my previous professors but he is still open to assist me in any way he can. Overall my experience here has been great. Lots of staff eager to help and an excellent focus on student success with not only resources but in how students are treated.

I hated school and didn't want to go back but since I transferred here I actually am enjoying it except when I have to talk to strangers.



The majority of dorm windows do not open. In my opinion, that is a major fire and safety hazard. What if there's a


fire in the hall, or an active shooter? We have to break the window, which is dangerous and could prove difficult.

#### What academic program are you currently enrolled in?





## How do you primarily take classes at your school?





### What is your current age?





### What is your gender?




