I have extensive experience advising students through my position as an Assistant Professor of Psychology at the University of Science and Arts of Oklahoma. In particular, all first-year students meet with their advisors before the beginning of the semester. Given the university's size (approx. 734 students), I have been fortunate to provide mentorship and advisement to well over 30 incoming first-year students. In addition, I have been selected by many students to be their minor advisor.
