A signed copy of your 2020 Federal 1040 and accompanying schedules is also acceptable. If you file an amended tax return, a signed copy of your 1040X is required in addition to your IRS Tax Return Transcript. If your legal parents live in the same household but filed separately, both IRS transcripts must be provided, even if they are not legally married. If you or your parents file a tax return from Puerto Rico or other U.S. Territory/Freely Associated State, a signed copy of that tax return is acceptable documentation.

Parent(s) who report that they are not and are not required to file a 2020 federal tax return will be required to obtain an IRS "Verification of Non-Filing" letter dated on or after October 1, 2021. A Verification of Non-Filing letter can be obtained by using IRS form 4506-T and checking box 7.
