President's Report:

SGA Committee Development:

Brooks: We sent out the committee signup form and it has received six responses.

Melendez: Some of the responses are present tense which would make these concerns urgent so we should try to talk to Gabi soon.

Monica: To clarify, hasn't seen the responses. When problems are as serious as this, the best course of action is to take it to the dean of students who oversees counseling services.

Casey: Do we believe that the wording of the question could be leading to mostly negative responses?

Peebles: Potentially, but that hasn't stopped people from giving positive feedback.

Bathroom Survey:

Peebles: Sent the survey to Casey and was wondering if she had sent it to the student body.

Casey: Sent it to the IT Listserv to send out to the student body.
